Americans reported losing \$5.9 BILLION to scams in 2021

- Never give your Social Security Number, account numbers, passwords or other personal financial information over the phone unless you initiated the call to a trusted source.
- Police, IRS and other government entities will never ask for money over the phone or threaten you with jail time.
- Be suspicious of anyone claiming to be a family member in need of funds through wire-transfers.
- If anyone demands they need funds through gifts cards it is most likely a SCAM.

If things seem wrong they probably are. Hang up and call your local government or family for more information before you give anyone money over the phone.


Package Theft

Those who steal packages from other people's homes—are known as Porch Pirates!

Let's look at a few ways to keep your packages safe and prevent theft.

- Use a P.O. Box
- Require a signature
- Leave "delivery instructions" so you can ask the package be left by a side door or a spot not visible from the road.
- Invest in a doorbell camera.
- Know your neighbors, and look out for each other. Trusted neighbors can help hold packages while you are out.

- Get a locking mailbox approved by the USPS
- Have your package delivered to your workplace if allowed.
- If you use Amazon, consider using a package locker (Amazon Prime members have access for free).
